City of Winter Park

The City of Winter Park celebrates the official formation of a hyperlocal initiative to elevate the awareness of all arts & culture non-profits within city limits. In Sept 2016, the City Commission formed a subcommittee of the Public Art Advisory Board with the purpose to collaborate & promote as a whole. The Arts & Culture Subcommittee, is planning an upcoming year of promotions and a special weekend devoted entirely to arts and culture in WP. In addition, the city has developed a logo, hashtag #WPinspires, marketing plan, an exclusive webpage www.cityofwinterpark.org/arts-culture that features a comprehensive directory of all non-profit arts & cultural organizations within the city limits & an extensive event calendar with special events.



Cultural Council of Greater Jacksonville

A 13' tall giraffe sculpture has been installed in Klutho Park, to commemorate the site of Jacksonville's first zoo, started over 100 years ago. There is anticipation for more permanent and temporary sculptures to fill the space. The giraffe was created by Melissa Russell of White Springs, and has been funded through private donations, and a \$2,500 grant from Springfield Preservation and Revitalization. Phase I of the Downtown Investment Authority's Urban Arts Program is coming to a close, and transition into Phase II has begun. Jacqueline

A musical wind tower, grand stone faces and a REALLY big bird are some of the artworks along the new Florida Keys Sculpture Trail. It's the realization of an inspiration of Key West philanthropists, John Padget and Jacob Dekker. Their vision is now a reality thanks to a huge collaborative effort with the Monroe County Board of Commissioners, the County's Art in Public Places Committee and Elizabeth Young, E.D. of the Arts Council.
