City of Tampa

Congratulations to the City of Tampa who received four awards from the Hillsborough County Planning Commission! Lights On Tampa received three awards - two merit awards for the innovative program, and one "Signature of Light" award for the lighting of the downtown bridges. The City of Tampa, also received the prestigious, Jan Abell Award, for outstanding contribution in historic preservation. The judges felt the park hit all the right notes, balancing neighborhood context, local history, storm water, recreation needs, and cultural heritage. These projects would not have been successful without inter-departmental partnerships, private sector contributions, as well as the involvement of artists in the design process.

Pensacola Downtown Improvement Board

In a couple of weeks, fine artists Evan Levin and Ashton Howard will begin painting a 3,000 sq. ft. mural in downtown Pensacola, creating the city's largest-ever live art production. During a nine-day live art performance that spans this year's Foo Foo Festival, Levin and Howard will scale the southeasterly facing wall of the Jefferson Street Parking Garage on a lift to transform the red brick walls into a mural that will depict Pensacola's heritage and commemorate the recent discovery of the oldest settlement in the U.S.

Levin and Howard began sketching the mural onto the wall this week and plan to begin painting on Nov. 1. The massive live art performance is expected to take approximately 200 hours to complete.
